



**COVID-19 update: School Restart:** Our school staff and Governors are working hard towards bringing our school children and staff back into school in a safe and structured way in the new academic year. For now, I can tell you that we are planning the following:

- Primary 7 will return to school in the week beginning 24<sup>th</sup> August.
- Primary 1 will be invited in for an "Open Day" in the week of 24<sup>th</sup> August in small groups, and will start back to school in the week beginning 31<sup>st</sup> August - details to follow.
- Primary 2 - Primary 6 will also return in the week beginning 31<sup>st</sup> August.
- We anticipate that when pupils return they will all be in together with 1m social distancing in place for the normal full day, there will be no remote learning.
- We may also consider staggering break and lunch times to allow for continued social distancing requirements. Start and finish times should be as normal.

As soon as we have more concrete details we will let you know. With so many uncertainties surrounding the current situation, we want to reassure you that we will do everything we can, within the boundaries and guidelines provided, to ensure that the children coming in to our care in August/September will have the very best experiences we can give them. All our staff share a strong sense of community and a genuine concern for our children and remain committed to providing the very best opportunities for the children in our care.
