<u>Cyclists:</u> We hope to run our Active Travel campaign in the third term. Children will be given details of where and when to park their bikes and scooters. Those who cycle to school <u>must wear their helmets</u> and <u>must always walk with the bicycle or scooter on the school pathways</u>.

If your child is absent or has to leave school during the school day for an appointment you must send an explanation note for our records. Please inform the school and arrange to have a test if your child or anyone in your household becomes unwell with possible Coronavirus symptoms (new, continuous cough; high temperature or fever; anosmia (loss or change to your normal sense of smell or taste)).

School Uniform Please ensure the children have a coat and warm jumper in school every day, even in the warmer weather, as we will continue to encourage outdoor learning and play as much as possible. The girls may wear their summer dresses to school in the last term (if they wish). White or navy leggings may be worn underneath the dresses - children must wear socks, preferably not trainer socks, rather than bare feet. Flipflops or open-toed sandals should not be worn in school. If track suit bottoms are worn, please provide plain navy bottoms with no writing.

<u>Pencil Case Reminder:</u> Could you please check/restock your child's pencil case over the Easter holidays to ensure they have a supply of pencils, colouring pencils, rubbers, sharpener and glue stick.
